Welcome back to a brand new school year! We hope you are ready for the Autumn Term after a lovely Summer break. Our new topic is **The Great Fire of London** and we are looking forward to learning about Samuel Pepys and how London has changed over time. This term, we are planning special visits from emergency service workers and to our local church. ### **English**

Our first class reading book will be 'Little Red Reading Hood'. We will be focusing on a variety of other texts in reading lessons to develop comprehension skills. In writing lessons, we will be studying a variety of genres including narrative, non-fiction and poetry. We will begin with a focus on story writing. Throughout all lessons and subjects we will be developing our oracy skills, through paired and group discussion whilst increasing our use of vocabulary and grammatically accurate sentences. We will continue to encourage the use of Nelson Handwriting Style and look forward to working towards using smaller lined books ready for KS2. We would appreciate your support at home by encouraging your child to read daily – either home readers or texts of their choice – and record this in their home school planner.

### Maths

In Maths, we will be focussing on numbers to 100. Children need to be able to count to 100, forwards and backwards as well as recognising and writing any number between 0 and 100. Please also encourage your children to read and tell the time at home at every opportunity using an analogue clock (a clock with hands) to the nearest 5 minutes . Further to this, please encourage children to understand coins and money where possible by adding quantities of coins to £1, knowing £1 is the same as 100 pence and finding change from £1.

### Homework

Daily reading is expected. Your children will have a phonics book to practice their reading skills. We also recommend reading stories to your child for pleasure. This will help develop your child's story voice when hearing adults read. We have a list of recommended reads on our website in 'Our Learning > Year 2 > Reading'. Books can be borrowed from the local library free of charge.

Children can access Numbots online and TTRS to support with maths skills. Some homework may be set on Google Classroom (children will be made aware of this in homework books).

### PΕ

On PE days, please make sure your child comes to school in the correct Woodside PE kit that follows our uniform policy. Children will have lessons both indoors and outdoors. Please remove all jewellery on these days.

### Science

During this term, we will be learning about Materials. This will include naming materials and their properties, discovering where materials come from and exploring the best materials for specific purposes. Children will have the opportunity to carry out practical tasks to develop their working scientifically skills. This may include investigating the best material for an umbrella (testing waterproof materials).

### Computing

Throughout the year we teach online safety. This term, children will be learning coding. Children have access to Purple Mash at home via RMUnify.

## **Topic**

This term, our topic is The Great Fire of London. In History/ Geography, we will be studying London life and how London has changed over time. In Design Technology, we will be studying mechanisms and creating moving vehicles. In Music, we will be learning how to keep a steady beat. In RE, we will be studying Hinduism and Christianity, including God and loving kindness. In PSHE, we will be learning about Relationships – Families and Friendship, Safe Relationships and Respecting Ourselves and Others.
