Your child will be provided with homework to consolidate their learning that takes place during school time. Our early morning starts from 8am are also recommended to make every moment count. All Year 6 children are welcome. We are planning to teach your child various skills this term including: textiles, gymnastics, basketball and hockey to name a few. As always, we appreciate all of the support you provide at home and look forward to working with you to help your children progress further with their learning.

English

Our class text will be Everest and A Monster Calls! We will be focusing on a variety of other texts in reading lessons to develop comprehension skills. In writing lessons, we will be studying a variety of genres including narrative, non-fiction (non-chronological report) and poetry. Throughout all lessons and subjects we will be developing our oracy skills, through paired and group discussion whilst increasing our use of vocabulary and grammatically accurate sentences. We will continue to encourage the use of Nelson Handwriting Style. We would appreciate your support at home by encouraging your child to read 20 minutes daily – either home readers or texts of their choice – and record this in their home school planner.

Maths

In maths, we will be focussing on fractions, decimals and percentages and the four operations (+, -, x, /). It is expected that you child knows off by heart times tables to 12x12. They will be able to apply these facts to more complex maths – especially fractions, decimals and percentages. Please encourage your children to read and tell the time at home at every opportunity using an analogue clock (a clock with hands), compare it to digital times in the 12 hour (am/pm) and 24 hour clocks and have opportunities to find totals to and change from £10.00 when shopping. These are important everyday life skills.
